Sec. 6321. Lien For Taxes,

If any person liable to pay any lax neglects or refuses to pay the same after demand, the amount (including any interest, additional amount, addition to tax, or assessable penalty, logether with any costs that may accrue in addition thereto) shall be a lien in layer of the United States upon all property and rights to property, whether real or personal, belonging to

Sec. 6322. Period Of Lien.

Unless another date is specifically fixed by law, the lien inposed by section 6321 shall arise at the time the assessment rs made and shall continue until the hability for the amount so assessed (or a judgment against the taxpayer arising out of such liability) is satisfied or becomes unenforceable by teason of tapse of time

Sec. 6323. Validity and Priority Against Certain Persons.

(C) With Recorder Of Deeds Of The District of Columbia.—In the office of the Recorder of Deeds of the District of Columbia, if the property subject to the lien is situated in the District of Columbia.

(2) Situs Of Property Subject To Lien. - For purposes of paragraphs (1) and (4), property shall be deemed to be situated-

(A) Real Property. - In the case of real property, at its

physical location, or

(B) Personal Property—In the case of personal property, whether tangible or intangible, at the residence of the taxpayer at the time the notice of tien is filed. For purposes of paragraph (2)(B), the residence of a corporation or partnership shall be deemed to be the place at which the principal executive office of the business is located, and the residence of a tarpayer whose residence is without the United States shall be deemed to be in the District of

(3) Form -The form and content of the notice referred to in subsection (a) shall be prescribed by the Secretary Such notice shall be valid notwithstanding any other provision of law regarding the form or content of a notice of Een

(g) Reliling Of Notice.—For purpose of this section-

(1) General Rule.—Unless notice of then is relied in the manner prescribed in paragraph (2) during the required refilling period, such notice of then shall be treated as filed on the date on which it is filed (in accordance with

subsection (I)) after the expiration of such religing period.

(2) Place For Filling.—A notice of lien refited during the required retains period shall be effective only— (A) If such notice of lien is relifed in the office in which the

prior notice of lim was filed; and

(3) Required Reliling Period.—In the case of any notice of lien, the term "required reliling period" means—(A) the one-year period ending 30 days after the

Sec. 6325, Release Of Lien Or Discharge Of Property.

(a) Release Of Lien.—Sebject to such regulations. as the Secretary may prescribe, the Secretary shall issue a certificate of release of any tien imposed with respect to any internal revenue tax not later than 30 days after the day on

(1) Liability Satisfied or Unenforceable .—The Secretary finds that the liability for the amount assessed, together with all interest in respect thereof, has been fully satisfied or has

become legally unenforceable; or

(2) Bond Accepted.—There is furnished to the
Secretary and accepted by him a bond that is conditioned
upon the payment of the amount assessed, together with all interest in respect thereof, within the time prescribed by law (including any extension of such time), and that is in accordance with such requirements relating to terms, conditions, and form of the bond and sureties thereon, as may be specified by such regulations.

(k) Disclosure of Certain Returns and Roturn Information For Tax Administration Purposes .-

(2) Disclosure of amount of outstanding tien -It a notice of lien has been (ried pursuant to section 6323(1), the amount of the outstanding obligation secured by such lien may be disclosed to any person who furnishes salisfactory written evidence that he has a right in the property subject to such lien or intends to obtain a right in such property.
