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Excerpts From Internal Revenue Code

Sec. 6321. Lien For Taxes.

If any person liable to pay any lax neglects or refuses to pay the same after demand, the amount (including any interest, additional amount, addition to tax, or assessable penalty, together with any costs that may accrue in addition thereto) shall be a lien in layer of the United States upon all property and rights to properly, whether real or personal, belonging to such person

Sec. 6322. Period Of Lien.

Unless another date is specifically fixed by law, the lien imposed by section 6321 shall arise at the time the assessment is made and shall continue until the Nability for the amount so assessed (or a judgment against the taxpayer arising out of such Lability) is satisfied or becomes unenforceable by reason d lette of time

Sec. 6323. Validity and Priority Against Certain Persons

- (a) Purchasers, Holders Of Security Interests, Mechanic's Lienors, And Judgment Lien Creditors,—The Fen imposed by section 6321 shall not be valid as against any perchaser, incider of a security interest. nechanic's lengt, or pagment ten creditor until notice thereof which meets the requirements of subsection (I) has been filed by the Secretary

 - (A) Under State Laws -
 - (i) Real Property —In the case of real property, in one office within the State for the county, or other governmental subdivision), as designated by the laws of such State. in which the property subject to the lien is shualed; and
 - (ii) Personal Property In the case of personal property, whether rangible or intangible, in one office within the State (or the county, or other governmental subdivision), as designated by the laws of such State, in which the property subject to the lien is situated; or (8) With Clerk Of District Court.—In the office of the

clerk of the United States district court for the judicial district in which the properly subject to lien is situated, whenever the State has not by law designated one office which meets the requirements of subparagraph (A), or

(C) With Recorder Of Deeds Of The District of Columbia.—In the office of the Recorder of Deeds of the District of Columbia, if the property subject to the lien is situated in the District of Columbia

(2) Situs Of Property Subject To Lien - For purposes of paragraphs (1) and (4), property shall be deemed to be

(A) Real Property. - In the case of real property, at its physical location, or

(B) Personal Property -In the case of personal properly, whether langible or intangible, at the residence of the larpayer at the time the notice of lien is fied For purposes of paragraph (2)(8), the residence of a corporation or partnership shall be deemed to be the place at which the principal executive office of the business is located, and the residence of a taxpayer whose residence is without the United States shall be deemed to be in the District of Columbia

(3) Form —The form and content of the notice released to in subsection (a) shall be prescribed by the Secretary Such notice shall be valid notwithstanding any other provision of law regarding the form or content of a notice of fen.

(g) Relating Of Notice,-For purpose of this section-

(1) General Rule.—Unless notice of lien is refiled in the manner prescribed in paragraph (2) during the required relising period, such notice of lien shall be treated as filed on the date on which it is filed (in accordance with

subsection (f)) after the expiration of such reftling period.

(2) Place For Filling.—A notice of lien relited during the required reftling period shall be effective only— (A) If such notice of tien is refiled in the office in which the

prior notice of Ken was filed; and
(8) In any case in which 90 days or more prior to the date of a refainly of notice of lien under subparagraph (A), the Secretary received written information (in the manner prescribed in regulations issued by the Secretary) concerning a change in the taxpayer's residence, if a notice of such lien is also fied in accordance with subsection (I) in the State in which such residence is located, REQUESTED BY

(3) Required Relifing Period,—in the case of any notice of lien, the term "required relifing period" means—
(A) the one-year period ending 30 days after the

expiration of 6 years after the date of the assessment of the tax, and

(B) the one-year period ending with the expiration of 6 years alter the close of the preceding required relising period for such notice of lien.

Sec. 6325. Release Of Lien Or Discharge Of Property.

(a) Release Of Lien.—Subject to such regulationsas the Secretary may prescribe, the Secretary shall issue a certificate of release of any tien imposed with respect to any internal revenue lax not later than 30 days after the day on

(1) Liability Salistied or Unenforceable —The Secretary finds that the Rability for the amount assessed, together with all interest in respect thereof, has been fully satisfied or has

become legally unenforceable; or
(2) Bond Accepted —There is furnished to the
Secretary and accepted by him a bond that is conditioned upon the payment of the amount assessed, together with all interest in respect thereof, within the time prescribed by law (including any extension of such time), and that is in ascerdance with such requirements relating to terms, conditions, and form of the bond and surcties thereon, as may be specified by such regulations

(2) Disclosure of amount of outstanding Ben. - If a notice of lien has been filed pursuant to section 6323(I), the amount of the outstanding obligation secured by such lien may be disclosed to any person who lurnishes salislation written evidence that he has a right in the property subject to such lien or intends to obtain a right in such property

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
