

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FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND DECREE OF DIVORCE

JOHN E. TOMASEVIC and JOHANNA TOMASEVIC,

This matter having duly come on for trial, Plaintiff being present and represented by ROBERT A. GRAYSON, ESQ., Defendants being present and represented by MELVIN LAUB, ESQ., and MICHAEL SMILEY ROWE, ESQ., the Court having considered the evidence, testimony and stipulations of the parties now renders its findings of fact, conclusions of law and decree of divorce as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. That the Plaintiff is a resident of the State of Nevada.
- 2. That Plaintiff and Defendant were married to each other in Virginia City. Nevada on January 31, 1981, and ever since that time have been, and now are, husband and wife.
 - 3. That there are no minor children born the issue of this

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marriage.

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- 4. There is community property to be adjudged by this Court.
 - 5. Plaintiff and Defendant are incompatible in marriage.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

From such Findings of Fact, the Court concludes as a matter of law that it has jurisdiction over the subject matter herein and the parties hereto; that Plaintiff is entitled to an absolute and Final Decree of Divorce from the Defendant upon grounds of incompatibility, dissolving the bonds of matrimony and releasing each of the parties from the responsibilities and obligations thereof and restoring each of the parties to the status of an unmarried person.

DECREE

reason of the law and findings aforesaid, WHEREFORE, bу Plaintiff is hereby granted an absolute Decree of Divorce, bonds of matrimony now and heretofore forever dissolving the LEE existing between Plaintiff, E. TOMASEVIC the Defendant JOHN E. TOMASEVIC, and each of the parties is hereby restored to the status of a single person to the same extent and for all purposes if said marriage had never existed.

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IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the property of the respective parties is hereby distributed as more fully set forth in the Stipulation entered in open court as evidenced by the transcript of the Court Reporter to be filed in this matter as Exhibit "A" hereto.
