## STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES

#### BETWEEN THE

These Standard Operating Procedures (hereinafter SOP) are made and entered into by and between the Douglas County Sheriffs Office (hereinafter DCSO) and the Washoe Tribal Police (hereinafter WTP).

WHEREAS, each of the above named agencies provides law enforcement services within their respective jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, the Washoe Tribe of Nevada and California and the Douglas County Board of Commissioners have signed an Intergovernmental Agreement for Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Services; and,

WHEREAS, WTP Captain Richard Varner and DCSO Sheriff Ron Pierini desire to enter into SOP to set forth operational guidelines between the parties.

# NOW THEREFORE, THE PARTIES MUTUALLY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Designated Persons To Request Assistance. That pursuant to Section 3 of the Intergovernmental Agreement for Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Services, any request for mutual aid law enforcement services, including search and rescue, must be made by the individuals as set forth below. Recognizing that duty assignments are often rotated among personnel and changes may not be immediately relayed, it is sufficient under the terms of this SOP, that WTP or DCSO personnel holding the rank of sergeant or above can make the request for assistance by notifying dispatch.
- A. That a WTP request for assistance may only be made by the following:

Captain Richard Varner Sergeant John Leonard Sergeant David Blackeye

**B.** That a DCSO request for assistance may only be made by the following:

Sheriff Ron Pierini Captain David Aymami Captain John Milby Undersheriff Paul Howell Captain Dan Britton Captain Joe Duffy

- 2. Communications. All requests for mutual aid assistance will be channeled through Douglas County Dispatch which currently dispatches both WTP and DCSO. Any changes to personnel as set forth in IA or B above should be made to Douglas County Dispatch.
- 3. First Response. That neither WTP nor DCSO will be the first to respond on-scene to a request for assistance unless it is an in-progress high risk incident. Such in-progress high risk incidents include, but are not limited to: situations where a person is being severely injured by another (not accidents); hostage situation or barricaded suspect; on-going domestic violence where a person is being injured; and an active shooter. If the responding agency is first on the scene, their directive is to secure the scene to protect life and property until the requesting agency arrives.
- 4. SWAT Team. That if D.C.S.O. deploys a Special Weapons and Tactic (SWAT) team and/or Crisis Negotiation Team (CNT) to WTP at their request, tactical control of the situation, including CNT, will be turned over to the SWAT team commander, while overall supervision will remain with WTP.
- 5. Duration and Amendments. These SOP shall remain in full force and effect from the date hereof unless amended in writing by agreement by both parties hereto or the Intergovernmental Agreement for Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Services is terminated or not renewed. Any revisions to this SOP shall be in the form of Amendments attached to the original SOP.
- 6. Severability. It is believed that nothing in these Standard Operating Procedures is in conflict or contrary to the provisions of the Intergovernmental Agreement for Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Services. If a provision is found to be in conflict, it will not affect the remaining provisions. Any changes must be resolved by amending these SOP.
