# CONTRACT FOR SERVICES OF INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR



WHEREAS, Douglas County (herinafter County), a political subdivision of the State of Nevada, from time to time requires the services of independent contractors; and

WHEREAS, it is deemed that the services of Dr. David A. Johnson M.D. (herinafter Contractor) herein specified are both necessary and desirable and in the best interests of Douglas County; and

WHEREAS, Contractor represents that he is licensed to practice medicine in the State of Nevada, qualified, equipped, staffed, ready, willing and able to perform and render the medical services hereinafter described;

Now, Therefore, in consideration of the agreements herein made, the parties mutually agree as follows:

- 1. EFFECTIVE DATE OF CONTRACT. This contract shall become effective July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014.
- 2. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR STATUS. The parties agree that Contractor, his associates and employees shall have the status of an independent contractors and that this contract, by explicit agreement of the parties, incorporates and applies the provisions of NRS 284.713, as necessarily adapted, to the parties, including that Contractor is not a Douglas County employee and that

There shall be no:

- (1) Withholding of income taxes by the County:
- (2) Industrial insurance coverage provided by the County;
- (3) Participation in group insurance plans which may be available to employees of the County;
- (4) Participation or contributions by either the independent contractor or the County to the public employees retirement system;
  - (5) Accumulation of vacation leave or sick leave;
- (6) Unemployment compensation coverage provided by the County if the requirements of NRS 612.085 for independent contractors are met.

3. INDUSTRIAL INSURANCE. Contractor further agrees, as a precondition to the performance of any work under this contract and as a precondition to any obligation of the County to make any payment under this contract, to provide the County with a work certificate issued by a qualified insurer in accordance with NRS § 616B.627. Contractor agrees, prior to commencing any work under the contract, to complete and to provide the following written request to the qualified insurer:

David A. Johnson, M.D. has entered into a contract with Douglas County to perform work from July, 1 2013 to June 30, 2014 and requests that an industrial insurance provider qualified and licensed to offer such insurance within Nevada, provide to Douglas County 1) a certificate of coverage issued pursuant to NRS § 616B.627 and 2) notice of any lapse in coverage or nonpayment of coverage that the contractor is required to maintain. The certificate and notice should be mailed to:

Douglas County Manager Post Office Box 218 Minden, Nevada 89423

Contractor agrees to maintain required workers compensation coverage throughout the entire term of the contract. If contractor does not maintain coverage throughout the entire term of the contract, contractor agrees that County may, at any time the coverage is not maintained by contractor, order the contractor to stop work, suspend the contract, or terminate the contract.

- 4. SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED. The Contractor will provide medical services to all inmates incarcerated in Douglas County Detention Facilities as more specifically outlined in Attachment A, and as required by the National Commission on Correctional Health Care (NCCHC) and the Sheriff-Coroner's Department Medical Manual. Contractor will oversee the functions of the Jail Medical Facilities according to the (NCCHC) requirements for accreditation as currently published or as may be amended. Contractor, or his designee, will attend at least one (NCCHC) National Conference on Correctional Health Care, at the time of his choosing during the effective date of this contract.
- 5. PAYMENT FOR SERVICES. During the effective date of this contract, Contractor agrees to provide the services set forth in Paragraph 4 at a cost of either \$6,467 per month or \$8,570 per month dependent upon the coverage time as outlined in Attachment "A" paragraph number 1. This amount reflects an increase of \$125 per month, or \$1,500 over the life of the contract, and is intended to reimburse contractor for costs associated with attending the (NCCHC) National Conference on Correctional Health Care. Any expenses paid by the contractor in excess of this amount will not be reimbursed. Contractor must show proof of attendance while this contract is in effect, or payment made to facilitate this training will be withheld from the final payment due during this contract. Douglas County will make said monthly payments to Contractor upon receipt of invoice. Contractor will not be compensated for any hours the contractor is not actually performing services to the County. The County agrees to be responsible for supplies belonging to Carson Tahoe Physicians Clinic and used in the care of or issued to inmates incident



to their care while in the offices of Carson Tahoe Physicians Clinic. Carson Tahoe will bill the county jail at a rate of 60% of the usual and customary fees. In the event that the supplies or equipment required exceed \$2500, the Contractor must receive approval from the Captain of the Jail Division or the Undersheriff prior to performing the procedure unless, in the opinion of the Contractor, immediate steps are necessary to protect the life of the patient.

- 6. TERMINATION OF CONTRACT. This contract may be revoked without cause by either party prior to the date set forth in paragraph (2), provided that a revocation shall not be effective until 90 days after a party has served written notice upon the other party. The Contractor shall submit invoices for work performed to the date notice was given.
- 7. MEDICAL LICENSE AND MALPRACTICE INSURNACE. Contractor agrees to maintain his medical license in active status and good standing for the State of Nevada during the term of this Contract. Failure to maintain this license will result in immediate termination of this contract. Any complaints filed against the Consultant arising out of his duties as a doctor must be reported to the County within ten days of being filed with an appropriate medical licensing board. Contractor also agrees to acquire and maintain medical malpractice insurance in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000 during the term of this contract. Copies of both the medical license and certificate of medical malpractice insurance must be sent to the Douglas County Manager and the Douglas County Sheriff's Office.
- 8. CONSTRUCTION OF CONTRACT. This contract shall be construed and interpreted according to the laws of the State of Nevada. Any dispute regarding this Contract shall be resolved by binding arbitration, with an arbiter selected from a list maintained by the Nevada Supreme Court of senior/retired judges, with both parties to pay their own attorney fees. If the parties cannot agree on an arbiter, then the party defending the controversy shall make the ultimate decision on the arbiter. There shall be no presumption for or against the drafter in interpreting or enforcing this Contract.
- 9. APPLICABLE LAWS. Contractor shall fully and completely comply with all applicable local, state and federal laws, regulations, orders, or requirements of any sort in carrying out the obligations of this contract, including, but not limited to, all federal, state, and local accounting procedures and requirements and all immigration and naturalization laws.
- 10. ASSIGNMENT. Contractor shall neither assign or delegate any rights, obligations or duties under this contract without the prior written consent of the County other than with the exception of a Nevada licensed and qualified PACC/RN acting under the direct supervision of Contractor.
- 11. COUNTY INSPECTION. The books, records, documents and accounting procedures and practices of Contractor related to this contract shall be subject to inspection, examination and audit by the County.

- 12. DISPOSITION OF CONTRACT MATERIALS AND COPYRIGHT. Any books, reports, studies, photographs, negatives or other documents, data, or other materials prepared by or supplied to Contractor in the performance of its obligations under this contract shall be the exclusive property of the County and all such materials shall be remitted and delivered, at Contractor's expense, by Contractor to the County upon completion of the project, or termination or cancellation of this contract
- 13. PUBLIC RECORDS LAW. Contractor expressly agrees that all documents ever submitted, filed, or deposited with the County by Contractor (including those remitted to the County by Contractor pursuant to sections 4, 5 10 and 11), unless designated as confidential by a specific statue of the State of Nevada, shall be treated as public records pursuant to NRS Ch. 239 and shall be available for inspection and copying by any person, as defined in NRS § 0.039, or any governmental entity.
- 14. INDEMNIFICATION. Contractor agrees to indemnify and save and hold the County, its agents and employees harmless from any and all claims, causes of action or liability arising from the performance of this contract by Contractor or Contractor's agents or employees.
- 15. MODIFICATION OF CONTRACT. This contract constitutes the entire contract between the parties and may only be modified by a written amendment signed by the parties and approved by the Board of County Commissioners.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have caused this contract for detention facility medical services to be signed and intend to be legally bound thereby.

# ATTACHMENT A

1. CONTRACTOR will maintain a schedule of services as follows:

The three days-a-week schedule will be as follows:

Monday, Wednesday, Friday - Minden Jail Facility.

The five days-a-week schedule\* will be as follows:

Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday - - Minden Jail Facility,

With at least one visit per week to the Stateline Jail Facility.

The services should be provided during a.m. hours unless pre-arranged and agreed upon by both parties.

CONTRACTOR is not to provide the five days-a-week schedule unless requested by the Jail Division. The five days-a-week schedule must be provided for a minimum 30 day period. In the event that Contractor does not work the minimum 30 day period for the five days a week, the payment will be pro-rated accordingly for the month.

CONTRACTOR will work all holidays that fall on scheduled work days, unless prior approval is made with a jail supervisor to work another day adjacent to the holiday to make up for taking the holiday off.

- 2. CONTRACTOR shall see to the medical needs of all inmates, make a sanitation inspection of the culinary and surrounding areas with the assistance of a deputy, and make regular sanitation and cleanliness inspections of the cellblocks and housing areas. Said inspections will be performed at least once per week with a report to be sent to a designated jail supervisor.
- 3. CONTRACTOR shall assure compliance with National Commission on Correctional Health Care (NCCHC) guidelines regarding Jail Medical Facilities; and insure proper stocking and security for all medical supplies including medication.
- 4. CONTRACTOR shall, in the event of a medical emergency, assure that normal protocol is followed for transportation and disposition of the inmates.
- 5. CONTRACTOR shall keep and record that information necessary to insure the proper care of inmates and juvenile detainees; provide legal documentation of same, and; comply with all essential standards as set forth by NCCHC guidelines.
- 6. CONTRACTOR shall provide the Jail Administration with reports, inspections analysis and purchases under documentation as required by NCCHC guidelines and the Douglas County Sheriff's Office.

- 7. The CONTRACTOR shall maintain the medication inventory log, dispensation log and an adequate supply of those medications deemed appropriate to be stored in the medical lockers of the jail facilities.
- 8. Review and countersign all medical records generated in the Jail Facilities
- 9. Oversee and be responsible for the procurement, distribution and storage of prescription medication used in the Jail Facilities.
- 10. Evaluate and approve medical treatment protocols and the Jail Medical Manual.
- 11. Assist in arranging specialist consultation as needed by inmates.
- 12. Attend Quarterly meetings with Jail Medical Staff.
- 13. Participate in NCCHC Jail evaluations for continued accreditation.
- 14. Post and adhere to a 24 hour seven days-a-week on call list for nurses.
- 15. The on call nurse will respond to after hour inquiries within 60 minutes of contact.

# HEALTH INFORMATION PORTABILITY AND ACCOUNTABILITY ACT

#### 1. DEFINITIONS.

- 1.1 Contractor shall mean Dr. David A. Johnson and his associates or employees.
- 1.2 Covered Entity shall mean Douglas County.
- 1.3 Individual shall have the same meaning as the term "individual" in 45 CFR164.501 and shall include a person who qualifies as a personal representative in accordance with 45 CFR 164.502(g).
- 1.4 Privacy Rule shall mean the Standards for Privacy of Individually Identifiable Health Information at 45 CFR part 160 and part 164, subparts A and E.
- 1.5 Protected Health Information shall have the same meaning as the term "protected health information" in 45 CFR 164.501, limited to the information created or received by Contractor from or on behalf of Covered Entity.
- 1.6 Required by Law shall have the same meaning as the term "required by law" in 45 CFR 164.501.
- 1.7 Secretary shall mean the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services or his designee.
- 1.8 Service Agreement or Agreement shall mean that certain agreement between Contractor and Covered Entity.

All other capitalized terms not defined herein shall have the meanings assigned in the Privacy Rule.

## 2. OBLIGATIONS AND ACTIVITIES OF CONTRACTOR.

- 2.1 Contractor agrees to not use or further disclose Protected Health Information other than as permitted or required by the Agreement or as Required by Law.
- 2.2 Contractor agrees to use appropriate safeguards to prevent use or disclosure of the Protected Health Information other than as provided for by this Agreement.
- 2.3 Contractor agrees to mitigate, to the extent practicable, any harmful effect that is known to Contractor of a use or disclosure of Protected Health Information by Contractor in violation of the requirements of this Agreement.

- 2.4 Contractor agrees to report to Covered Entity any use or disclosure of the Protected Health Information not provided for by this Agreement of which it becomes aware.
- 2.5 Contractor agrees to ensure that any agent, including a subcontractor, to whom it provides Protected Health Information received from, or created or received by Contractor on behalf of Covered Entity agrees to the same restrictions and conditions that apply through this Agreement to Contractor with respect to such information.
- 2.6 Contractor agrees to provide access, at the request of Covered Entity, and in the time and manner designated by Covered Entity, to Protected Health Information in a Designated Record Set, to Covered Entity or, as directed by Covered Entity, to an Individual in order to meet the requirements under 45 CFR 164.524.
- 2.7 Contractor agrees to make any amendment(s) to Protected Health Information in a Designated Record Set that the Covered Entity

directs or agrees to pursuant to 45 CFR 164.526 at the request of Covered Entity or an Individual, and in the time and manner designated by Covered Entity.

2.8 Contractor agrees to make internal practices, books, and records relating to the use and disclosure of Protected Health Information received from, or created or received by Contractor on behalf of, Covered Entity available to the Covered Entity, or at the request of the

Covered Entity to the Secretary, in a time and manner designated by the Covered Entity or the Secretary, for purposes of the Secretary determining Covered Entity's compliance with the Privacy Rule.

- 2.9 Contractor agrees to document such disclosures of Protected Health Information and information related to such disclosures as would be required for Covered Entity to respond to a request by an Individual for an accounting of disclosures of Protected Health Information in accordance with CFR 164.528.
- 2.10 Contractor agrees to provide to Covered Entity or an Individual, in time and manner designated by Covered Entity, information collected in accordance with Section 2.9 of this Agreement, to permit Covered Entity to respond to a request by an Individual for an accounting of disclosures of Protected Health Information in accordance with 45 CFR 164.528.

### 3. PERMITTED USES AND DISCLOSURES BY Contractor.

3.1 General Use and Disclosure Provisions: Except as otherwise limited in this I Agreement, Contractor may use or disclose Protected Health Information on behalf of, or to provide services to, a Covered Entity for the following purposes, if such use or disclosure of Protected Health Information would not violate the Privacy Rule if done by Covered Entity, or

violate the minimum necessary policies and procedures of Covered Entity, for the purpose of performing the Service Agreement.

- 3.2 Specific Use and Disclosure Provisions:
  - 3.2.1 Except as otherwise limited in this Agreement,
    Contractor may use Protected Health Information for
    the proper management and administration of the
    Business Associate or to carry out the legal
    responsibilities of the Contractor.
  - 3.2.2 Except as otherwise limited in this Agreement,
    Contractor may disclose Protected Health Information
    for the proper management and administration of the
    Contractor, provided that disclosures are required by
    law, or Contractor obtains reasonable assurances from
    the person to whom the information is disclosed that It
    will remain confidential and used or further disclosed
    only as required by law or for the purpose for which it
    was disclosed to the person, and the person notifies the

Contractor of any instances of which it is aware in which the confidentiality of the information has been breached.

- 3.2.3 Except as otherwise limited in this Agreement,
  Contractor may use Protected Health Information to
  provide Data Aggregation services to Covered Entity
  as permitted by 42 CFR 164.504(e)(2)(i)(B).
- 3.2.4 Contractor may use Protected Health Information to report violations of law to appropriate federal and State authorities, consistent with 164.502(j)(1).

# 4. OBLIGATIONS OF COVERED ENTITY.

- 4.1 Covered Entity shall notify Contractor of any limitation(s) in its notice of privacy practices to the extent that such limitation may effect Contractor's use or disclosure of Protected Health Information.
- 4.2 Covered Entity shall provide Contractor with any changes in, or revocation of, permission by Individual to use or disclose Protected Health Information, if such changes affect Contractor's permitted or required uses and disclosures.
- 4.3 Covered Entity shall notify Contractor of any restriction to the use or disclosure of Protected Health Information that Covered Entity has agreed to in accordance with 45 CFR 164.522, to the extent that the same may effect Contractor's use or disclosure of Protected Health Information.
  - 4.4 Permissible Requests by Covered Entity: Covered entity shall not request Contractor to use or disclose Protected Health Information in any manner that would not be permissible under the Privacy Rule if done by Covered Entity

(unless permitted for a Contractor under the Rule for data aggregation or the management and administrative activities of Contractor.)

## 5. TERM AND TERMINATION.

- 5.1 Term. The Term of this Agreement shall be effective as of the date first written above, and shall terminate when all of the Protected Health Information provided by Covered Entity to Contractor, or created or received by Contractor on behalf of Covered Entity, is destroyed or returned to Covered Entity, or, if it is infeasible to return or destroy Protected Health Information, protections are extended to such information, in accordance with the termination provisions in this Section. Termination of this Agreement shall automatically terminate the Service Agreement.
- 5.2 Termination for Cause. Upon Covered Entity's knowledge of a material breach by Contractor, Covered Entity shall provide an opportunity for Contractor to cure the breach or end the violation, and Covered Entity shall:
  - 5.2.1 Provide an opportunity for Contractor to cure the breach or end the violation and terminate this Agreement if Contractor does not cure the breach or end the violation within the time specified by Covered Entity, or
  - 5.2.2 Immediately terminate this Agreement if Contractor has breached a material term of this Agreement and cure is not possible.
  - 5.2.3 If neither termination nor cure are feasible, Covered Entity will report the violation to the Secretary.
- 5.3 Effect of Termination.
  - 5.3.1 Except as provided in the following paragraph, upon termination of this Agreement, for any reason, Contractor shall return or destroy all Protected Health Information received from Covered Entity, or created or received by Contractor on behalf of Covered Entity. This provision shall apply to Protected Health Information that is in the possession of subcontractors or agents of Contractor. Contractor shall retain no copies of the Protected Health Information.
  - 5.3.2 In the event that Contractor determines that returning or destroying the Protected Health Information is infeasible, Contractor shall provide to Covered Entity notification of the conditions that make return or destruction infeasible. Upon mutual agreement of the

Parties that return or destruction of Protected Health information is infeasible, Contractor shall extend the protections of this Agreement to such Protected Health Information to those purposes that make the return or destruction infeasible, for so long as Contractor maintains such Protected Health Information.

#### 6. MISCELLANEOUS.

- 6.1 Regulatory References. A reference in this Agreement to a section in he Privacy means the section as in effect or as amended, and for compliance is required.
- 6.2 Amendment. The Parties agree to take such action as is necessary to amend this Agreement from time to time as is necessary for Covered Entity to comply with the requirements of the Privacy Rule and the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act, Public Law 104-191.
- 6.3 Survival. The respective rights and obligations of Contractor under Section 5.3 of this Agreement shall survive the termination of this 6.4 Interpretation. Any ambiguity in this Agreement shall be resolved in favor of a meaning that permits Covered Entity to comply with the Privacy Rule.
